1991 - First Laparoscopic Cholecystectomy.

1991 / 1993 - Participation in laparoscopy courses in Italy (Turin, Milan, Bassano del Grappa) and France (Lyon, Paris).

Since 1995 - Acquisition of greater expertise through the teachings of the world's leading urological laparoscopists at the John Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland University, the Charité University Clinic, Berlin, the Sorbonne and the Mountsouris Hospital, Paris, and the specialised centres of Bordeaux, Cleveland, Milan, Rome and Bassano del Grappa.

Dr Repetto was the first urologist in Italy to harvest a laparoscopic kidney graft from a living donor, to perform operations with gas-less technique, to carry out a laparoscopic kidney harvesting operation from living donor (using the gas-less technique) and have a Da Vinci operating robot as a stable feature of his armamentarium.

From 1998 to 2011 he was in charge of urological laparoscopy at the Nephro-Urological Department of Turin's Molinette Hospital.

From 2000 to 2011 he was in charge of the laparoscopic harvesting of kidney grafts from living donors at the Renal Transplants Centre of Turin's Molinette Hospital.
